It was an epic fight for the title of "FIM World's Fastest Motorcycle". Al will be going back to Bolivia in July to break the 300mph barrier.

The rallye draws over 300 people displaying over 150 of the finest vintage motorcycles anywhere in the country. Join us at Diamond Don's Motorsports & RV Park which is just one mile outside of Jefferson, Texas. #### An engineer explains Lucas electronics

A sheet of paper crossed my desk the other day and as I read it, realization of a basic truth came over me. So simple! So obvious we couldn't see it. John Knivlen, Chairman of Polamar Repeater Club, an amateur radio group, had discovered how IC circuits work. He says that smoke is the thing that makes ICs work because every time you let the smoke out of an IC circuit, it stops working. He claims to have verified this with thorough





testing. I was flabbergasted! Of course! Smoke makes all things electrical work. Remember the last time smoke escaped from your Lucas voltage regulator, didn't it quit working? I sat and smiled like an idiot as more of the truth dawned. It's the wiring harness that carries the smoke from one device to another in your Mini, MG or Jag. And when the harness springs a leak, it lets the smoke out of everything at once, and then nothing works. Bob Ohman and I were already thinking about the possibility to start a Norton Reference Library in conjunction with the Parts Depot, and Bones' donation has pushed us off the dime. Soon there will be a bookshelf in the Parts Depot trailer with these items and others that we collect. Many of us have relevant documentation that is either no longer of much interest or perhaps duplicated in our collections. I have several items I will pull out for the Reference Library. I think the Library will end up consisting of two departments, one of which is a permanent, stationary set of documents that should not leave the Parts

Depot. This would be mainly Parts Books and documentation that helps in identifying the stuff in the Parts Depot. The second section would be things that could be borrowed by club members, and for those things we would have a sign-out book. For these kinds of items, Workshop Manuals, for example, having duplicate copies would be advantageous.



At a later date we will post an initial inventory of the Reference Library in the newsletter. As always, your comments on our plans are greatly appreciated.

President's Award (Every so often we publish the rules concerning the President's Award for the benefit of newer members and also for older members whose memory is on the decline) The President's Award will be given at the Winter Banquet to the member who has accumulated the most points, which are issued on the basis of participation in official club events during the previous "Club Year", which begins with the Winter Banquet in early February. The President himself is ineligible for the award, although we will keep a tally on him. You score 5 points for riding a Norton to one of our official events, 2 points for riding any other brand of motorcycle, 1 point for driving, taking the bus, walking, or whatever. Full points (5) are scored if you host a club event. Passengers on motorcycles earn the same score as the rider. "Riding a Norton" means arriving at the meeting, riding an operational Norton. The trailer may not be visible from the meeting site. We make an exception to the visible trailer rule for long-distance events such as the Four Corners Rendezvous. Two (2) extra points are awarded for paying the entry fee and showing your Norton at the English Conclave. Four (4) extra points are awarded for entering and winning a ribbon. We award 5 points for attending an INOA Rally, even without a motorcycle, and an additional 5 points if you ride a Norton at the Rally. In recent years we have added another way to score points toward the President's Award: solo Norton rides, for a which a single point is awarded with a maximum of one per day and a yearly maximum of 25. We leave it to you to decide what constitutes a "Norton ride". To be credited with the points, however, you must inform the Secretary about it. A claim for a solo ride should include a date, even if you have to approximate it. The President is the sole arbiter of disputes over points awards. Rules changes are not retroactive. Periodically we will review the scores from the previous month's event(s), update the tally of points and publish it in the newsletter.

#### Norton Colorado Membership and Participation by Eric Bergman

For a number of years I've been keeping track of some basic statistics about membership in Norton Colorado and participation in the club's events. This information is summarized in the graph below, which I recently updated with the stats from 2017. The things plotted are:

- 1) Number of Events, the number of official events scheduled.
- 2) Memberships, the total of single and couples/family memberships (not total number of members).
- 3) Participants, the number of members (including spouses and children in family memberships) who participated in at least one event.
- 4) Nortons ridden, the number of times someone scored 5 points toward the President's Award. This slightly over-estimates the number of Nortons ridden because 5 points are awarded for hosting an event.

The graph provides a quick overview of what might be called the State of Health of the club. Memberships have steadily risen (except for a notable drop in 2015) over the past 20 years or so, from about 55 in 1999 to about 90 in 2017. Historically, we seem to lose about 10 members every year who fail to renew their membership and then through the year we add about that many back, and usually a few more. At the moment we are at 72 renewals from a 2017 membership of 92, so I expect about 10 of the laggards from 2017 to finally renew their membership and we'll move on from there. This is quite a typical pattern. On the other hand, I fully expect the membership in Norton Colorado to begin a steady decline someday and in hindsight it may turn out that 2014 was our high point.

The number of events we schedule has stabilized in recent years at around 24 per year, so changes in the number of participants and Nortons ridden represent important aspects of the health of the club, even more so than the number of memberships. By those measures, there is some evidence of a decline in the frequency with which Nortons are hauled out and started. We all recognize the temptation, with advancing age, to avoid the opportunity to kick-start the wet-sumped Norton in the garage and instead pull out the modern button-equipped bike instead, even for club events. Our Nortons are becoming genuinely OLD motorcycles and it is inevitable that we will see fewer and fewer of them being ridden. It is the natural order of things. On the other hand we often make an effort to stave off the inevitable, and some of you clearly take that approach to your choice of motorcycles. Good on ya!
