Summer 2023 Travels by Scott Robinson

mom. I rode my Road King out. After a family birthday party we took Mom's car out to Hershey, PA to visit The home of Hershey's chocolate. We did all the chocolate stuff for a day then



visited the AACA Transportation Museum for a few hours. The museum was very nice and had quite a collection of cars.

After dropping Julie and Mom off in Indy I headed home via southern Illinois and The Ozarks in Missouri. Along the way I crossed the Mississippi at Chester, Illinois.

Chester, I was excited to learn, is the home of

Elzie Segar, the man who created Popeye. I'm a big Popeye fan so I spent some time in town visiting the Popeye museum and checking out some of the

Popeye character statues.

The next day I spent cruising 300 miles of the roller coaster roads of the Ozarks. So much fun, nicely paved roads, relatively empty, beautiful scenery on a beautiful sunny day. I spent another half day playing and then headed home through southern Kansas on US 50.



Next up was a return to British Columbia, Canada. On a previous trip the locals said they ride in the Kootenays region. I had no plans. I rode where I rode each day then every night I decided where to go next. I listened to the locals and went where they suggested.



British Columbia is a beautiful place, green, mountainous, plenty of lakes and rivers. It reminds me of Colorado about 30 plus years ago, laid back and empty. The roads are well paved and curvy which makes for fun riding. Other drivers are polite and drive well. Speed limits are rather slow, but most drivers, including myself, seem to



consider them a suggestion rather

than written in stone. I had no issues on the road at all. One day I rode two hundred miles, round trip, on a beautiful mountain road along the Columbia River and counted about 12 other vehicles along the way.


One of my favorite features are the ferries. Roads end at a river or lake and travelers then board a ferry for the ride across where the road continues. The ferries carry all vehicles, including some very big trucks. They run constantly so there wasn't much of a wait, and they are free.

The weather was perfect, except for one day coming home. My bike was a pleasure to ride. I had all the fun I could handle, wore myself out and came home. I ended up being out for 11 days and rode just under 3700

miles. Another fun and exciting trip.








Girls and their Nortons!


