Press Release

On Monday 26 February Andover Norton International Limited issued court proceedings against The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited for breaching the terms of ANIL's exclusive trade mark licence agreement to use the NORTON and COMMANDO trade marks to sell spare parts and assemblies for vertical twin cylinder engine Norton motorcycles made between 1952 and 2002.

In the same court proceedings ANIL is also suing The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd for trade mark infringement and passing off, in relation to its use of the NORTON and COMMANDO trade marks to sell spare parts and assemblies for vertical twin cylinder engine Norton motorcycles made between 1952 and 2002. The full list of defendants in the case are: (1) The Norvil Motorcycle Co Ltd, (2) Ms Susan Miriam Emery, (3) Mr Leslie John Emery, (4) Norton Motorsports, Inc, and (5) The Norton Motorcycle Co Ltd.

ANIL's exclusive licence was granted in November 2003 by Norton Motorsports Inc., a predecessor of The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited. Once an "exclusive" licence has been granted then no further licences can be granted for the same rights. This is a strict legal requirement.

The NORTON and COMMANDO trade marks to which ANIL's 2003 exclusive licence relates were acquired on 17 April 2020 by The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited, which belongs to the Indian company TVS Motor Company Limited. The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited became the licensor of the trade mark rights to ANIL at that time

Shortly afterwards on 5 May 2020 UK trade mark No 2128517 for NORVIL and UK trade mark No 2128766 for COMMANDO were assigned by The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd to The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited.

The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd uses the trade marks NORTON and COMMANDO to sell spare parts and assemblies for vertical twin cylinder engine Norton motorcycles made between 1952 and 2002. The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd states on its website:

"We are proud to have a license from the Norton brand name owners to manufacture and supply genuine parts. With this we can manufacture and supply parts for the Norton Dominator and Norton Single plus the Norton Commando and Norvil too, for all of the pre 1977 models.

With the latest acquisition of the Norton brand by the TVS group, our license has been further strengthened."

The use by The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd of the trade marks NORTON and COMMANDO to sell spare parts and assemblies for vertical twin cylinder engine Norton motorcycles made between 1952 and 2002 contravenes ANIL's 2003 exclusive licence. Further, the granting of any licence to The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd to use the trade marks NORTON and COMMANDO to sell spare parts and assemblies for vertical twin cylinder engine Norton motorcycles made between 1952 and 2002 would contravene the terms of ANIL's trade mark licence with The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited

ANIL's court action against The Norton Motorcycle Co. Limited and The Norvil Motorcycle Co. Ltd also accuses both parties conspiring and causing damage to ANIL through breaching of the terms of ANIL's exclusive 2003 licence

ANIL's court proceedings were filed with the Intellectual Property Enterprise Court, and are now a matter of public record.

ANIL will not make any further comment on the ongoing proceedings.

New Product: SmartCarb from Julian Kowalewski


Hi, To all of you who have expressed an interest in the Smart Carb.

I have revisited the operational information supplied by Smart Carb and they attribute its operability as follows.

The Needle has a flat ground into it which faces the engine side of the carb. The venturi is different in shape and I think more importantly the float bowl is not vented to the atmosphere as normal but it is vented into the venturi. This combined with normal atmospheric pressure acts upon the flow of fuel delivered through the carb. Obviously, they are not going to disclose exactly how it works but this pressure difference within the float bowl changes as altitudes change all of which have an effect on fuel delivery and that's how they describe why changes in altitude etc are

and that's how they describe why changes in altitude etc are not required to be matched with conventional jetting requirements.

Combined they claim a power increase, greater atomization of fuel and less lubricant requirements.


Rocky Mountain Motorcycle Museum





Here's some information I found on the web in regard to Norton Drones:

NR731: 38 bhp from 10 kg (23 lb) constant speed engine. Low Specific fuel consumption: 0.52 lb/bhp per hour at cruise. Air cooled. In production, 1989. Formerly P73. Was fitted into Banshee 300 RPV military target drone.

Norton P73 Rotary drone engines which are super light, super powerful and very compact.

They weigh only 21.7 pounds and pro-

duce a staggering 32.8 bhp @ 7500 rpm. They measure in depth from the front of the propeller flange to the rear of the mounting plate 190 mm. The oil pump projects 32 mm beyond this. The width of the P73 across the widest part is 237 mm and it measures in height 262 mm. This is a very compact engine which will fit into a radial cowl perfectly. The engine operates with far less vibration than either a two or four stroke power plant. The engine was tested to full JAR regulations, 50 hours of testing with no appreciable wear. This regulation allows this engine to be used in powered sailplanes or motor gliders. The 50 hour test was conducted swinging a 26 inch by 20inch pitch propeller. The engine can be run as high as 10,000 for brief periods.
