The Extreme North Sloper Rocky Mountain Hi By Darrell Teeples



I was making my way to Superior Arizona to ride with Bob Herman and shake the rain off in February this year, and was sitting in a motel parking lot on the phone with Richard Florance. He hatched a plan that I should come east to Colorado a week early and we could take 4 days to get from Steamboat Springs to the 4 corners rally and visit a different hot springs every day on the way. It did not take me very long to subscribe to his thinking. I started to hatch my 3 week trip.

My objective was to ride only two lane and less traveled roads. I employed a Butler motorcycle map of the rocky mountain states.

1st day: 433 mi. Over Mt Hood and east through central Oregon to a little town, Halfway, 30 mi from Idaho. It was 102 degrees that afternoon when I rolled into town.

2nd day: 282 mi. Crossed into Idaho on the backbone of Brownlee dam on the Snake river. Brownlee reservoir was pleasant that early AM. You ride along it for 17 mi before you transition into Idaho. Rode by Cascade lake and on Wildlife Canyon and Ponderosa Pine Scenic Byways and up over the Banner Summit in to Stanley Idaho. Rain and lightning last half of the day.

3rd day: 418 mi. Left Stanley in the clouds and mist. Made the Caribbean of the Rockies, Bear lake, and Laketown. The locals told me that its called the caribbean of the rockies because of its size 20 mi long 8mi wide and the color of the water, turquoise, and white sand. Had a great dinner that night on a deck overlooking the lake. Crossed into Wyoming back into Idaho and down into Utah this day. Rain all night.

4th day: 235 mi. Crossed over east and hit 191 south through the Flaming Gorge, and into Vernal. If you have not seen the Flaming Gorge you need to. Moderate rain all day.

5th day: 188 mi. Into Colorado. Met Richard in Craig. I followed him on the long way to his home. He showed me some great roads with scenery to match.

6th day: Regrouped, cleaned up the bike a bit. Relaxed, and enjoyed Steamboat. First time there for me. Bob Herman rolled in that afternoon from Crestone.

7th/10th day: 800 mi. The 3 of us left Steamboat and made Mavreeso early afternoon on 10th day. Did some nice camping and hot springs.

11th/14th day: 200 +/- mi. Mavreeso campout and ralley. Had a great time seeing good friends and making new ones. Good food. Good fires complete with tech talk and tales.



14th day: 258 mi. Through Hite on the Bicentennial Byway and Capitol Reef to Torrey UT. Hot and in the afternoon some brutal winds coming in all directions.

15th day: 468 mi. Crossed into Nevada at Baker on 21. Hit 50 and rolled on to Austin Nevada. In Austin after a dinner in the International Bar, which has been occupying the same spot of ground, in some form, since the 1860's I met a fellow from St. Louis who was traveling two lanes back home from a rally in the pacific NW on his Kawasaki ZRX 1200 R. We had lots of notes to compare and stories to swap. A nice chap.


16th day: 504 mi. North and west now. Through Denio back into Oregon to Fields, Frenchglen and on through the Malheur National Wildlife Area, into Bend. Fields Or. One gas pump, 87 octane and one building to go with it that is approximately 16x16. Thats all there is. In that building there is a cafe rm, kitchen, potty, bar in separated rm complete with at least a 5 bottles of booze, and a stand up soda



counter, complete with a big old fashioned blender to make shakes and malts. When they are closed you have to travel 182 miles from gas to the next gas and services. When they are open they are 124 miles in, going North. This stretch of Oregon and Nevada Hwy 140 makes the loneliest road seem happily crowded. It was 1:20 so lunch was in order. The Gal championing the grill was 4' from me in the kitchen as I sat at the cafe bar. From the menu I ordered a fried egg sandwich. There were 3 other woman in the place, locals I guess, and let me tell you, I had a blast hooting and hollering and laughing. With the benefit of a fried egg sandwich tailor made to my liking with lots dill pickles and lettuce. I hated to leave. Hot.

17th day: 188 mi. To Sisters around Mt Jefferson and to Detroit reservoir and town. Into the Bull of The Woods Wilderness, down the Clackamas river canyon into a little logging town Estacada. Then the final 22 mi. Home.

3865.1 miles, with a moving average of 59 mph. Every day was filled with great riding. Tons of sweepers, canyons, passes with truly wonderful vistas. It was a good time. Already thinking about routes for next year. Hmmm, I have a friend in Spearfish South Dakota

Astonishingly, this also beat the records for the more powerful 750cc and 1,000cc classes.

The Wild Beast Within Us Ride Wild Animal Sanctuary, Keensburg, CO

Nonmembers outnumbered members today! Ed, George and Greg are BMAC guys, always welcome at our events. Bill Easter is a friend of Jack's from California who is a Vincent enthusiast. Nevertheless it was a satisfying collection of vintage British bikes, a lovely ride, and a very enjoyable and interesting time at the The Wild Animal Sanctuary. We wandered around the Sanctuary for about 3 hours, seeing lions, tigers, bears, leopards, wolves, mountain lions, and about a million bunnies who have learned how to stay out of trouble around the big carnivores. The animals were mostly lethargic from the heat and could be found napping in the shade in various areas. The facility there is amazing. They have done a fantastic job of providing healthy and naturalistic living spaces for the animals and trying to give them the best possible lives. There is an underlying sadness, of course, that a facility like this is necessary. The animals have mostly been rescued from a variety of abusive and appalling conditions. They came to the Sanctuary lacking the instincts needed to survive in the wild, so this is about the best imaginable scenario for them.

It was a gorgeous day for riding and we enjoyed the trip out to Hudson through Brighton and Fort Lupton after breakfast at Gunther Toody's in Northglenn. After the tour we went to the Pepper Pod Restaurant in Hudson and had a very good lunch. That is definitely the place to eat in Hudson. On the ride back toward Denver we could see a huge thunderstorm ahead of us to the west, over the Boulder area, but at Fort Lupton we split up, James and Ed heading north, back to Fort Collins, and the rest of us headed south toward Denver, so no one had to think about getting out the rain gear.
