I see you have a picture of my 1000cc V twin Norton in the December newsletter. My name is Tony Harris and I live here in England. I very much enjoy your newsletters and like to see how things are done over the pond in Norton land. I am a member of the NOC and was Chairman of the local section for many years until I stepped down last year.

The picture you have is an early version of the bike and it evolved a bit later with different wheels, exhaust etc.

I made the motor and the only Norton bits were the heads. I also made the Egli type frame for it and fitted it with a Starter motor off the 888 / 1200 Harleys. The electronic self charging ignition system I also made as The engines are 55 deg.

I have enclosed a picture of the bike as it looks now and before. I have since sold the bike along with my Ariel Vtwin the VNH. This is a 700cc doubled up Ariel motor using two 350 NH top halves on a common crankcase in a slightly stretched std Ariel frame (the first incarnation was in a Norton Slimline frame as seen in the pictures). This has now done quite a few miles and runs very well like the ES4.

A guy has bought both bikes and also a spare motor and a number of parts to make another engine. The bikes are now in very good hands and used.

There is a picture that was taken some years ago with myself on the VNH, My good friend Eddy with his Vincent and Peter with his Vincent. A younger and slimmer Peter no less.

Malcolm Smith (1941 - 2024), who many consider to be America's most-renowned and best-loved motorcyclist, has died from complications of Parkinson's disease, which he battled for more than two decades. He was 83.

During his 83 years, Smith did it all: Rider. Racer. ISDT gold medalist. Shop tech. Service manager. Repair shop owner. Aftermarket distributor. Retail store owner. Actor. Sponsor. Philanthropist. Pro-motorcycling advocate. Father. Grandfather. Friend. And much more.

But over and above all that, Malcolm Smith was everyman's motorcyclist, an enthusiastic, funloving, driven and talented example of what motorcycling could do and be for the everyday enthusiast, and how the sport could affect our lives in unimaginable ways.

More than decade ago. Malcolm Smith wrote these words for the final chapter of his acclaimed 2015 autobiography: "It all started for me on March 9, 1941, in a small rural hospital in the village of Ganges, on Salt Spring Island, British Columbia, Canada... "Where it will end, no one knows. But you can be sure I'm going to enjoy every minute I have left, with a smile on my face, and my family nearby. Can't ask for more than that."

You can't, and he didn't...and the world's motorcycling fans are better for it.

Took my BSA to Orange County in the truck. Rode it around a bit to see friends. Then rode it about 80 miles or so up to the Hansen dam rally and show to see more old friends. I was not going to enter it in show, but since they asked when I arrived I did. Super stoked. Won best bike in show and best 1960s bike, 2 trophies. 





1969 Norton Mercury


